Selection Process







Updates and Analysis:

CITY COUNCIL

At the March 12, 2024 City Council meeting:

- Chief Byerley introduced Brad Kenneally, Police Captain.
- Public Works Director Thomas Bekele introduced Celeste Godoy, Administrative Assistant,

and Favian Real, Water Maintenance Worker I.

- The Public Works Department presented a project status update for the FY 2023-2024 Sidewalk Repair Project.
- City Council authorized staff to submit the Signal Hill General Plan Annual Progress Report for calendar year 2023 to the Governor's Office of Planning and Research and to the State Department of Housing and Community Development.
- City Council authorized the City Manager to enter into a four-year contract services agreement with CSG Consultants, Incorporated, to provide on-call building safety plan check and professional staffing services.
- City Council approved the exemption to City Policy 4.15 prohibiting alcohol on City property and a waiver of fees for the use of the Signal Hill Public Library Community Room and Zinnia Courtyard.
- City Council authorized the City Manager to accept grant funding through the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) 22.
- City Council approved a resolution for the filing of an application for the Los Angeles County Measure A Grant for the Hillbrook Park Improvement Project.
- City Council authorized the City Manager to extend the proclamation of the existence of a local emergency in response to the February 2024 winter storms for 60 days.

At the March 26, 2024 City Council meeting:

- The City of Long Beach Animal Care Services (LBACS) Bureau introduced a pet available for adoption and provided an update on animal services programs and licenses.
- Chief Byerley introduced Susan Garcia, Police Records Clerk.
- Staff presented an overview of the City's efforts and results in delivering homeless outreach and prevention services over the last year.
- City Council authorized staff to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) to solicit proposal from qualified consultant s to prepare an economic analysis and land use study for three proposed Opportunity Study Areas.

- City Council discussed City Council compensation and provided direction to staff to agendize the item at the City Council meeting of April 9, 2024.
- City Council approved the continuance of the proclamation of the existence of a local emergency in response to the February 2024 winter storms.

CENTENNIAL PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

The City of Signal Hill is celebrating 100 years of incorporation in 2024. In January 2022, City Council appointed the Centennial Celebration Committee, comprised of two council members, and one representative from the Planning and Parks and Recreation Commissions. The committee has been meeting since early 2023 to plan, organize, and map out the festivities throughout the year.

The city's website has also been updated and populated with information related to the centennial. There's a landing page that is dedicated promoting the centennial year, and more information is updated on a regular basis, including a countdown to the City's signature event on Saturday, April 27, 2024. Additional events, programs, and activities will be included on the website as details are finalized throughout the year.

PARK PROJECTS

Hillbrook Park

At the January 10, 2023 City Council Meeting the City Council approved entering into a Design Services Agreement with Architerra Design Group (ADG) for the Hillbrook Park renovation design services. The consultant and City staff held four community outreach and engagement meetings in

spring 2023.

Construction has begun and is projected to be completed by October 2024.

Civic Center Master Plan

City Council entered into an agreement with John Kaliski Architects, Incorporated (JKA), to develop, design, and recommend potential implementation alternatives for future enhancements of the Civic Center campus. Located at the center of the City, Signal Hill Park is already home to the City's major events including concerts, festivals, and social events, showcasing potential to be the destination for all things artistic and recreational in Signal Hill.
