- All nominations received will be presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission each month, based on the timeline, below.





CITY COUNCIL

At the November 12, 2024 City Council Meeting:

• New Police Officer, Zachary Williams, was introduced and sworn in.

- City Council reorganized selecting Keir Jones as Mayor and Tina L. Hansen as Vice Mayor.
- City Council approved the proposed Community Development Block Grant programs for FY 25 -26.
- City Council adopted the 2025 Commemorative Flag Display schedule.
